1. Introduction

As a member of the EU-ACME programme you can gain credits not only by participating in the accredited CME events, but also by reading the accredited content and answering the multiple choice questions (MCQs) in the Journal of European Urology, the EAU-EBU Update Series, the European Urology Supplements, the Journal of Pediatric Urology and shortly in the Journal of Neurourology and Urodynamics.

This study method offers flexibility. A classroom is not necessary. You decide for yourself when and where to study. The only thing needed is a PC and internet access.

2. General information

By visiting www.eu-acme.org/europeanurology (Fig.1) you can answer a set of MCQ's on-line from which 80% need to be answered correctly. The CME credits will then be attributed automatically - 1 credit point per article with a maximum of 50 credit points in 5 years.

3. Accessing database

Each member of the EU-ACME programme can login using the username and password he/she has received together with the EU-ACME membership card (Figure 2).



4. Reading an accredited article

On the front page all current issues of the journals are displayed together with a list of all accredited articles. In order to read a selected article, the user needs to click on the **CLICK TO READ** link (Figure 3).

5. Answering MCQs

By clicking on the icon with the text READ (Figure 4), you will be directed to the multiple choice questions which are based on the information provided in the article. Four possible answers are provided per question; only one of them is correct.




While answering the questions you can still read the article on-line by clicking on the icon next to the title of the article. After you have answered all questions, you need to click on the SUBMIT button (Figure 5).

6. Printing certificate

You may check your results and print the certificate by clicking on the CERTIFICATES button in the menu and then on DOWNLOAD button(Figure 6).

7. Registration of credits

The results are sent to the EU-ACME office where they are automatically registered in the database.

8. Archive

The questions remain available on-line until the next issue of the journal is published. The questions and the correct answers from past issues of the journals are placed in the Archive (Figure 7).
